### WEEK 3 Arsad from Indonesia

Around 17% of the rural population practice open defecation, with many unaware that it contributes to spreading diseases. He was often sick and open defecation caused neighbourhood disputes. With the support of Caritas Australia and its partner, Laz Harfa, he took part in hygiene, sanitation and financial management training. He decided to fund the building of a toilet.
